HOME BIOWICKED WORKSHOP

When - 9.30am to 3.30am Where - 1 Eura Court, Mt Louisa

Want to learn how to build a biowicked garden bed easily and cheaply in your own backyard? Due to requests from a number of members I will run a workshop on how to build a cheap biowicked garden system at

home using readily accessible materials. Over the past couple of years I have installed biowicked garden beds at about a dozen public and community areas around Townsville, and am currently working on a fifteen bed layout for the new Upper Ross Community Garden. The biowicked beds are a permaculture designed low maintenance system to grow food utilising food waste while also locking up carbon. To help show people how to build their own biowicked beds cheaply and easily I will be assisting a member of PcT to build one in their own yard using timber garden bed kits from Bunnings. As Education Officer for Permaculture Townsville Inc. I am running the workshop for free for members. If you haven't paid your dues don't worry as it is just \$40 on the day and, as a special deal for International Permaculture Day, that includes a one year membership in PcT. This is an opportunity to financially support your local permaculture group while also learning how to move towards a healthier and more resilient lifestyle.

May 9th - Saturday HERB GARDEN

When - 9.30am to 12.30am Where - 81 Ingham Road

As a joint workshop for both Permaculture Townsville and the Herb Society members I will demonstrate how to turn two readily available timber garden kits from Bunnings into a 1.2x1.2m Biowicked 'herb cube'. These \$39 kits are probably the cheapest and easiest way for most people to get treated pine that is both termite proofed



and safe for garden beds. The herb cube has been designed to replace the traditional permaculture herb spiral in urban areas, especially those areas with long hot dry seasons where rock spirals dry out without constant irrigation. The top area is suitable for dry loving herbs such as rosemary or lavender or even a kaffir lime or small fruit tree or papaya. The workshop is free for paid up members of both The Herb Society and Permaculture Townsville Inc. The public are welcome to attend for a minimal cost of \$40, which includes 1 years membership in Permaculture Townsville Inc.
